On May 22nd, McAfee Chief Public Sector Technology Strategist Ned Miller participated in a panel discussion hosted by the Center for Public Policy Innovation (CPPI) and Homeland Security Dialogue Forum (HSDF) titled "Cloud Strategies to Secure and Transform Government." Miller was in good company, as the event, which was closed to press, also featured remarks from Congressman Jim Langevin and the CIOs of the of the DoD and Intelligence Community, as well as senior tech officials from the Department of Homeland Security and Oracle. The session provided a unique opportunity to engage with congressional staff and private sector stakeholders about how cloud adoption can help achieve digital transformation across the federal government and enhance the security of federal networks.

Miller discussed the changing cloud landscape in both the private sector and government. He touched on the importance of implementing cloud correctly, and how the consequences of not doing so can put organizations in harm's way. He also illustrated that as enterprises and organizations work toward cloud adoption, many are at varying maturity levels and undergoing substantial organizational change. Miller reinforced that organizations must implement shared security models as they move to the cloud.
